

# JUDGMENT DAY REALISM

*Isaiah 2:6-22*

I. The final judgment destroys haughty height (vv. 10-17).

II. The final judgment destroys haughty hope (vv. 18-21).

## QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. What does Isaiah tell us about the spiritual condition of Judah (see vv. 6-9)? Were they humble or proud?
2. Pastor Nick said that God was Judah's *hobby* but not their *holy king*. What does that mean? Is it possible for people in the church today to approach God in a similar way?
3. What does Isaiah tell us about the coming day of judgment?
4. Why is he pointing Judah (and us) to this future judgment?
5. What does he command us to do at the end? How should the reality of future judgment change the way we live now?

## QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I tend to think of eschatology (i.e., the doctrine of the last things) as impractical and irrelevant? Does judgment day loom large on the horizon of my present life? Why, or why not?
2. What would it be like to stand before God on judgment day without the Mediator? Am I trusting in Him now and calling others to do the same so as to avoid this terrifying fate?
3. Is God my hobby, or my holy King?
