QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. Does Luke fail to finish the inspired history he is writing? Or does he give us a completed history?
2. How does the beginning of Acts help us to see that Luke is giving us a completed history as he ends with Paul under house arrest in Rome?
3. Why does Luke tell us about the twin gods carved into the front of the ship?
4. Who does Paul meet once in Italy as he makes the long journey to Rome? How does Paul respond to seeing these Roman believers? What does this teach us about our fellowship?
5. Who does Paul call to his home while under house arrest? Do they receive his gospel?
6. How does God use the contempt of the Jews and the chains of the apostle to advance the kingdom? What encouragement does this give us today?
7. What is one of the key takeaways for you from the Acts sermon series? What passage or sermon most impacted you?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I see the coherence and completeness of Luke's inspired history of the church? Why does this matter?
2. Do I tend to view trials as hindrances? How does the entire book of Acts encourage me to view difficulties, temptations, and tribulations?
3. How has God used the sermon series in Acts to challenge me? How has He used it to change me?
