QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

- 1. What did Francis Schaeffer say was the primary problem facing the church? Do you agree?
- 2. What is the remedy to our tendency toward self-sufficiency and self-absorption?
- 3. Why do you think this miracle is the only miracle of Christ (apart from the resurrection) that is recorded in all four gospels?
- 4. Why was Jesus seeking a desolate place? How did He respond when he found it to be a fully populated place?
- 5. What does it mean for Christ to be compassionate? Is He only willing to rescue us from our miserable condition, or is He also able?
- 6. How did this miracle point back to the OT? Why is that important?
- 7. How does this miraculous multiplication of bread encourage us in our sin and suffering?

QUESITONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

- 1. In what specific ways do I fail to rely on Christ's power and reflect His pity? What about my church?
- 2. Meditate on the fact that Christ is "full of pity joined with power" in light of this miracle. How does that reality both comfort and convict me?
