# THE SELF-SUFFICIENT SAVIOR

*Exodus 3:1-15*

I. The Savior makes Himself known through a self-sufficient *flame* (vv. 1-12).

II. The Savior makes Himself known through a self-sufficient *name* (vv. 13-15).

## QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. What is high and low self-esteem? How did each play out in Moses's life? What was it that delivered him from both, giving him a healthy self-estimation?
2. Where was Moses when the angel of the LORD appeared to him? Why is that significant?
3. Who is the angel of the LORD? How does the fuller revelation of the New Testament give us insight into the angel's identity that Moses wouldn't have had?
4. What is so significant about the fire in the bush? What does it symbolize?
5. Did Moses feel sufficient to deliver God's people from Egypt? Why, or why not?
6. Who would be with Moses in his insufficiency? How does this promise in v. 12 apply to us today?
7. What did God reveal His name to be? What is its meaning, and how does it relate to the fire in the bush?

## QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I struggle with high or low self-esteem? According to this text and the broader teaching of Scripture, what do I need?
2. Can I explain how God's independent imminence is revealed in both the flame and the name?
3. How does the revelation of God in Moses's call prepare the way for Christ? How might I use this story to share the gospel with an unbelieving family member or friend?

## GOD BECKONS US INTO HIS PRESENCE

**\*God's Call to Worship** | Hebrews 12:18-29

Pastor: For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them.

**People: But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.**

Pastor: See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. For if they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, much less will we escape if we reject him who warns from heaven.

**People: At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens."**

**This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of things that are shaken—that is, things that have been made—in order that the things that cannot be shaken may remain.**

Pastor: Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.
