Exodus 12:29-42 // March 9, 2025 AM

I. Yahweh climactically *defeats* those *without* the blood (vv. 29-36).

II. Yahweh climactically *delivers* those *with* the blood (vv. 37-42).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. Why is it deeply problematic to put our faith in our faith? Did the deliverance of the Israelite firstborns depend upon the strength of their faith? Why, or why not?
2. What do we learn about God's judgment from the fact that every Egyptian family, whether in the palace or the prison, suffered death?
3. How does the response of both Pharaoh and the Egyptians show that they have been defeated by God?
4. How many Israelites came out of Egypt? Are we to understand these numbers literally? What promise is fulfilled in Israel's large population?
5. Did anyone else come out of Egypt with the Israelites? What does this teach us about God's plan of salvation, and why should it lead us to rejoice?
6. Why is the Passover called a night of watching? Who does the watching?
7. If Jesus gave His body and blood for us, what should we give Him in response?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I struggle with putting my faith in my faith? If so, how does this error manifest itself in my life, and how does the Passover help to redirect my faith?
2. What or who is the only proper object of faith? How might I use this account in Exodus to share that with my children, grandchildren, or lost neighbors?
3. How many promises of God recorded in the book of Genesis are fulfilled in Exodus 12:29-42? What does this teach us about God?
