

**RESURRECTION REJOICING**  
*Exodus 15:1-21 // April 20, 2025 AM*

I. Rejoice in the *former* triumphs of your resurrection Lord (vv. 1-12).

II. Rejoice in the *future* triumphs of your resurrection Lord (vv. 13-18).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. Some scholars tell us that Exodus 15:1-21 interrupts the flow of the story in Exodus? Why does this way of thinking make no sense?
2. If Israel is singing this song corporately, why do they say "I" instead of "us" and "my" instead of "our"? What does this teach us?
3. What past event is leading Israel to glorify God in song? What past event should lead the church to glorify God in song?
4. How were God's wrath and love manifest at the same time in the Red Sea crossing? How are both revealed at the cross and empty tomb? Why does a denial of God's wrath necessarily lead to a denial of His love?
5. Read v. 11. How does it fulfill God's purpose to exalt Himself above the false gods of Egypt?
6. What future event does Israel sing of with great joy and confidence? What is our hope as Christians, and why must we sing of it?
7. Why does Moses tell us about Miriam and the ladies in vv. 20-21? How does their song and dance relate to the song and dance of the men in vv. 1-18?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. How is Israel's praise personal without being focused on the self but upon God? What does it teach us about the lyrics the church should sing today?
2. What are the past triumphs and future triumphs of Christ toward His church that were shadowed in the past and future triumphs of Yahweh toward Israel? Why do they impel me to sing?
3. Do I regularly cover my resurrected Lord with the kisses of joyous and reverent praise?
