- 1. Why is "cultural Christianity" problematic? How might I help an unbelieving friend to see that using this text?
- 2. Reflect on B. B. Warfield's statement: "Life close to God's word is life close to God." How has that proven true in my own experience?
- 3. How do the prohibitions in vv. 25-26 apply to my worship of God as a new covenant believer? What specific errors do I need to watch against?

GOD BECKONS US INTO HIS PRESENCE

*God's Call to Worship | Isaiah 40:9-11, 18-20, 28-31

Pastor: Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!" Behold, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; behold, his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.

People: To whom then will you liken God, or what likeness compare with him? An idol! A craftsman casts it, and a goldsmith overlays it with gold and casts for it silver chains.
