

A VOICE LIKE NO OTHER
Psalm 29:1-11 // August 3, 2025 AM

I. Glorify the King who *reveals* with His majestic voice (vv. 1-2).

II. Glorify the King who *ravages* with His majestic voice (vv. 3-9).

III. Glorify the King who *rescues* with His majestic voice (vv. 10-11).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. What is the main focus of Psalm 29, and how does it relate to David's prayer in Psalm 28:1?
2. What does it mean to ascribe or give glory to God? Are we making God more glorious when we do this? Why, or why not?
3. Who are the "sons of God" being addressed in this psalm? How does David's strong allusion to Genesis 6-11 help us to understand this?
4. The middle section of Psalm 29 likens God's voice to a storm? Where does this storm begin, and where does it end?
5. What is the storm a picture of, and how do God's people respond to it?
6. How does God's judgment equal the salvation of His people? How do we see this with Noah? How do we see this with Jesus?
7. What is a proper response for us to the call of this psalm?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. How does the voice of one I love and trust have the ability to stop my world and move me to action? Why should God's voice do this more than any other?
2. Do I simultaneously tremble before and delight in God's powerful word? How could I cultivate a more profound and joyous reverence toward God's voice?
3. Am I turning to God's word for grace in my weariness and peace in my turmoil?
