### QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. By not allowing the Israelites to come up Mount Sinai, was God communicating that He doesn't desire a relationship with them? Why do we need the rest of Israel's story to understand what is happening at God's mount?
2. What is the incarnation? Did Jesus only seem to become man, or did He really become a flesh-and-blood man?
3. What is the literally translation of "dwelt among us"? Why is this significant?
4. Did the Son stop being God when He became man?
5. How did Christ's humanity both veil and unveil the glory of God? How did the tabernacle of old do the same?
6. How can we be tempted to idolatry during the Christmas season? How does the true message of Christmas deliver us from it?

### QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I tend to view God as aloof? How does covenant history and the advent of Christ challenge this idea?
2. How has this sermon helped me to think about the tabernacle in our Exodus sermon series?
3. Have I succumbed to the consumeristic idolatry of the culture at Christmas time? How might I cultivate a greater spiritual sight of the incarnate Son to counteract that?
