

## GOOD AND ANGRY

*Exodus 32:15-35 // April 12, 2026 AM*

*Only a righteous mediator can save us from God's righteous anger.*

**I. Representing *God*, the mediator *administers* God's wrath (vv. 15-29).**

**II. Representing *Israel*, the mediator *appeases* God's wrath (vv. 30-35).**

### QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. Who is the most angry person in the Bible? What does this teach us about anger?
2. When Moses saw Israel's idolatry, what happened in his heart? Who did He reflect?
3. Why were there two stone tablets? What was written upon them? And what was the significance of Moses shattering them at the foot of Sinai?
4. What did Moses do to the golden calf, and what should we do with idols today?
5. Why did God tell the Levites to kill their fellow Israelites with the sword? How does this apply to the church today?
6. What did Moses offer to save Israel? Did God accept His offer? Why, or why not?
7. Why was Moses unable to carry away and cover over Israel's sin? Why is Jesus able to do this with our sin?

### QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. Do I burn with zeal for God's glory like Moses? Or do I tend to be apathetic like Aaron? How does the gospel promote zeal and deliver from apathy?
2. In what ways did the old covenant mediator Moses serve as a prophetic picture of the true mediator to come?
3. Have I received Jesus as my mediator?
