THE GLORY DESCENDS

Exodus 40:1-38

The holy God delivers us to dwell with us.

I. God's tent is assembled *as* a holy *mountain* (vv. 1-15).

II. God's tent is assembled *through* a holy *mediator* (vv. 16-33).

III. God's tent is assembled *unto* a holy *marriage* (vv. 34-38).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

1. What was the Maginot Line? What lesson does it teach us today?
2. What can easily become the Maginot Line in reformed churches like ours?
3. Why is roughly half of the book of Exodus focused on the tabernacle (chs. 25-40)? How is the tabernacle related to the exodus?
4. How is the tabernacle like Mount Sinai? How does it ultimately point back to Mount Eden? Why does this matter?
5. Was it enough to simply construct and assemble God's tent precisely as He commanded? Why not? What else was needed?
6. How does Exodus end with a cliffhanger? How does it lead us to Leviticus and ultimately to Christ?
7. What were some of the main lessons we learned from Exodus over the past year?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

1. How does the tabernacle relate to the original heaven and earth as well as the new heavens and earth?
2. What does my church have the tendency to make into a Maginot Line? How can I combat that?
3. How does Exodus 40 beautifully tie up the major themes of Exodus and drive them home to my heart? What are the biggest take aways for me from this sermon series?

GOD BECKONS US INTO HIS PRESENCE

***God's Call to Worship** | Hebrews 12:22-29

Pastor: You have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

People: See that you do not refuse him who is speaking. For if they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, much less will we escape if we reject him who warns from heaven.

Pastor: At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of things that are shaken—that is, things that have been made—in order that the things that cannot be shaken may remain.

People: Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.
